Contract Activity

- The Nurdle Patrol Expansion, Education, and Outreach was approved for funding for Year 4 on June 1, 2023.
- The Subaward Agreement No. 3 UTA20-000902 between The University of Texas at Austin and Texas A&M University-Corpus Christi (TAMU-CC) was fully funded for year four for the amount of \$37,269.00 to further enhance the website for usability and the ongoing maintenance of the phone app to help promote the awareness and education of Nurdle Patrol.
- Jace Tunnell moved to TAMU-CC in early August 2023, and Katie Swanson took over as PI on the project. A second subaward agreement between UTMSI and TAMU-CC for Jace Tunnell to continue working on expanding the Nurdle Patrol project was finalized on October 4th, 2023.

Risks and Impacts: None

Project Tasks:

Hire full-time staff to organize annual meetings, training, travel, manage website and develop promotional materials about Nurdle patrol.

Tracy Weatherall was hired during the first quarter of year one on July 1, 2020. Her contract was renewed on June 1, 2021 for year two, June 1, 2022 for year three and June 1, 2023 for year four.

Host the Texas Plastic Pollution Symposium (TPPS)

The 6th Annual Texas Plastic Pollution Symposium was a huge success again this year! It took place at TAMU-CC on March 21st, 2024. The planning committee met monthly beginning in October 2023 leading up to the event in March 2024. On Wednesday, March 20th, there was a social gathering with heavy hors doeuvres at the Executive Surf Club in downtown Corpus Christi, Tx. On Thursday March 21st, check-in began at 8:00AM and the symposium started at 9:00AM. Attendees received a cotton "Swag Bag" filled with a TPPS t-shirt, Nurdle Patrol mug, and other swag provided by the sponsors. A light continental breakfast was provided in the morning, box lunches in the afternoon and Rice Krispy treats and brownies were available during the afternoon break. Aarthi Ananthanarayanan, Director of Ocean Conservancy's Climate and Plastics Initiative, was the keynote speaker and Dr. Huy Vu, Environmental Protection Agency Region 6 Trash-Free Waters Coordinator, was the invited speaker. One hundred seventy people attended in-person and 40 attended virtually. There were 17 oral and 23 poster presentations.

Student Scholarships

As an incentive to attract students to attend the annual TPPS in-person and present their research, we offered a \$500 stipend to cover costs for travel and expenses again this year. Thirty-one students submitted abstracts, in which 8 were oral presentations and 22 were poster presentations. Eleven of these students traveled over 50 miles to attend and present their research and received the \$500 stipend. Additionally, student presentation awards were sponsored again this year by the Coastal Bend Bays & Estuaries Program. They gave \$300 for oral presentations (\$150 1st place, \$100 2nd place, \$50 3rd place) and \$200 for poster presentations (\$100 1st place, \$75 2nd place, \$25 3rd place).

Create Starter and Teacher Kits

The Nurdle Patrol Starter Kit was created during the first year of Nurdle Patrol (2020) for organizations to start-up their own Nurdle Patrol Citizen Science Project or to incorporate nurdle surveys into their existing monitoring program. The kits were designed to supply organizations with resources needed to conduct surveys, talk to their volunteers about nurdles, and provide a foundation for a successful monitoring program (Figure 1). As of May 31, 2024, 436 partners have received the starter kits.

The Nurdle Patrol Teacher Kits were also developed during the first year of Nurdle Patrol. These kits were developed based on the many requests from teachers across the United States, wanting to teach their students about how plastics reach the ocean and what negative impacts plastics have on the environment. These kits include a curriculum about nurdles entering the ocean, what negative impacts they can have, and what solutions are out there to prevent nurdles from getting into the waterways. These interactive teacher kits include six jars of nurdles, an information card about how to conduct a nurdle survey, a presentation about nurdles, and articles describing the problem (Figure 1). An updated version of the teacher kit curriculum was completed during the third quarter of Year 2 which includes an All Level Nurdle Survey, a Nurdle Hurdle Race, K-5 curriculum that includes lesson plans for age specific children in K-1, 2-3, and 4-5, and Middle School and High School Chemistry curriculums. These lesson plans are now linked to our webpage. As of May 31, 2024, 2,083 teacher kits have been shipped to educators in the USA, Canada, Mexico, Puerto Rico, Costa Rica, Columbia, Cuba, UK, Spain, Africa, South Africa, Australia, Turkey, Italy, and Thailand. We estimate that each teacher would have 60 students, which means these kits could reach close to 124,980 students, making this an effective tool for educating students about plastics along the Gulf of Mexico and beyond.

Plastic Free Life Kit

In January 2021, we initiated the Plastic Free Life Challenge. This friendly competition was designed as an incentive to encourage our partners and individuals to conduct as many nurdle surveys as possible each month. The group that conducts the most surveys wins a Plastic Free Life starter kit, containing 42 single-use plastic alternatives (Figure 2).

Individual Kit

Individual Kits were created during the first quarter of Year 3 to give individual citizen scientists everything they need to conduct a nurdle patrol survey on a regular basis. The kit includes a cotton zippered pouch with a Nurdle Patrol information card, a glass vial to hold the collected nurdles, a sticker and magnet (Figure 3). As of May31, 2024 there have been 658 individual kits distributed to citizen scientists.

Meet with organizations about Nurdle Patrol – Outreach




Figure 4. Nurdle Patrol Partners (yellow) and Teacher Kits (red) shipped in the continental United States, Canada, Cuba, Belize and Mexico.

During the fourth quarter of Year 4, we acquired 26 new Nurdle Patrol partners and shipped 83 teacher kits (Figures 4-5; Table 1-4). Virtual and in-person presentations and meetings were given to promote Nurdle Patrol to new organizations, including the following since June 1, 2023:

The Nurdle Patrol Facebook group is being utilized as a way to communicate with individual citizen scientists as well as new organizations about new efforts related to Nurdle Patrol. News stories, survey results, and other related material are also shared with the more than 3,000+ followers on the closed group Nurdle Patrol Facebook page. Also, the Nurdle Patrol Twitter account (public) was created to educate and inform the general public about plastic pollution and other science related topics. To date there are 996 followers.

Lisa Scobel, a graduate student studying Environmental Conservation from the University of Wisconsin-Madison, joined the Nurdle Patrol team in July 2023 as an intern and recruited 14 new partners along the Mississippi River's 2,350 mile stretch as well as New York and Canada. In addition, she published 5 Nurdle Patrol related articles that are posted on the nurdlepatrol.org website at https://nurdlepatrol.org/Forms/News/index.php. Lisa started a position at the Galveston Bay Foundation in July 2022 as the Marine Debris Coordinator and is helping to spread the word and sample in the Houston/Galveston area about Nurdle Patrol.




Figure 5. Nurdle Patrol Partners (yellow) and Teacher Kits (red) shipped to Alaska, Hawaii and worldwide.

Phone App Maintenance and update website

A contract was signed with TAMU-CC Conrad Blucher Institute (CBI) in July 2023. The work by CBI includes improvement to the phone app for Nurdle Patrol by adding all data onto a map, as well as updates to the Nurdle Patrol website (www.NurdlePatrol.org). Both versions of the original phone app, Android, and iOS, were released in May 2021.

For the first quarter of Year 4, they hired a graduate student to continue the development of the Nurdle Patrol website and mobile apps. The team focused on the technical transfer for the student. The student was able to set up and work on upgrading the software libraries for Nurdle iOS app and Nurdle Android app. The newer iOS version (1.3.5) is in the testing phase.




Figure 6. First prototype of the Nurdle interactive animation

During the second quarter, the development team completed the technical transfer process for the new research assistant and updated the point of contact (located at the bottom of the nurdlepatrol.org website) with the new email address (Jace.Tunnell@tamucc.edu). They also worked on developing a basic concept for the nurdle interactive animation for the website (Figure 6).




Figure 7. Nurdle interactive animation as of March 6, 2024.

During the third quarter of Year 4, the development team made progress on the nurdle interactive animation. The team asked volunteers to play the game and gathered feedback. There were several changes made to the animation following this feedback (Figure 7):

- Added colors and various sizes for the nurdles.
- Added more realistic graphics for the vehicle (trucks and ships).
- Shorten time to complete the animation.
- Added environmental health bar as additional game-over condition.
- Adjusted the way nurdles moving speed.

- Added counts to nurdle collected and nurdle uncollected.

During the fourth and final quarter of Year 4, the development team continued to enhance the functionality and user experience of Nurdle Patrol homepage and completed the deliverables in both data visualization and interactive animation.

Data Visualization Enhancements:

The team added an additional bar chart that displays the top US States and countries based on the highest number of nurdles collected over the past 30 days. They also added another set of bar charts to highlight the US and countries with the highest number of reports submitted in the past 30 days. These new charts are located on the Nurdle Patrol website's home page.




Figure 8. New bar charts on the Nurdle Patrol home page.

These new data visualization widgets were designed to encourage competitive spirit among the citizen scientists and regions, promoting more active participation in our data collection efforts (Figure 8).

Animation Development:

1. Enhancements to Nurdle Animation Scenarios:

Truck Scenario: The design team added detailed backgrounds to the truck animation scenario, which enhanced the visual appeal and realism of the environment where the nurdles are transported (Figure 9).




Figure 10. Nurdle Rush – Ship.

Ship Scenario Completion: The ship case scenario was added recently featuring animations that depict the accidental spillage of nurdles into marine environments (Figure 10).

2. Interactive Game Development and Testing:




Figure 11. Nurdle Rush menu option on Nurdle Patrol website.

The design team conducted a demonstration of their animated game to stakeholders and selected users to gather initial feedback. The insights obtained were invaluable and led to several bug fixes and enhancements. Notably, the team adjusted the game's difficulty to provide a more challenging and engaging experience for players. This involved refining the game mechanics and interaction patterns to ensure a smooth and enjoyable user experience on both personal computers and mobile devices. The Nurdle Animation, also known as Nurdle Rush can be accessed from the website menu bar (Figure 11) or the QR code that links to https://nurdlepatrol.org/nurdlerush (Figure 12).

Develop Educational and promotional videos

Videos produced from Year 1 funding (2020) have been placed on the YouTube Channel that the Mission-Aransas Reserve maintains, as well as posting to various social media platforms, and added to the NurdlePatrol.org website. For Year 2 (2021) funding, a four-part video series featuring Diane Wilson was produced and completed. The videos were shown at the Nurdle Patrol Film Festival on September 10, 2022. For Year 3 (2022) a documentary of Nurdle Patrol's work in Mexico was produced and completed in April 2023.

Public Awareness

The Nurdle Patrol rack card continues to be printed and describes how to conduct a Nurdle Survey on the front side and on the back side it has more detailed information including where to look for nurdles, what nurdles are, and a QR Code link to NurdlePatrol.org where a training video can be found. We created this card in English and Spanish (Figures 13 & 14).

The billboard campaign was created during the first year (2020) of Nurdle Patrol and was a huge success and has been extended into the third year with one near the Formosa Plastics Plant in Point Comfort, Tx (site 355751) in February 2022 and will remain at this site until February 2025 (Figure 15).

Nurdle Patrol is proud to have a permanent outreach installation at the Texas State Aquarium (Figure 16). The Texas State Aquarium reached out to us in the summer of 2021 to request video footage, images of nurdles, and text on the impact of plastics in the environment. From the information we sent, the aquarium was able to create an exhibit with a video that plays continuously, and a poster display educating folks on what nurdles are, how they get into the environment, and solutions for reducing plastics getting into the ocean.

Summary

A total of 4,296 surveys were conducted during the Year 4 and 179,340 nurdles were removed from the beaches, riverbanks, and lake shorelines across the United States, Mexico and additional countries worldwide. Nurdlepatrol.org acquired 120 new partners and shipped 315 teacher kits to educators in the USA, Canada, Mexico, Puerto Rico, Costa Rica, Columbia, UK, Spain, Africa, Australia, Turkey, Italy, Spain and Thailand. One hundred and sixty-seven individual kits were handed out during Year 4 (Table 7).
